The Dragon of Wantley

The Dragon of Wantley is a legend of a dragon-slaying by a knight on Wharnccliffe Crag (formerly known in the local vernacular as Wantley) in South Yorkshire, recounted in a comic broadside ballad of 1685, and enjoying widespread popularity in the 18th and 19th centuries. The ballad tells how the Falstaffian knight, Moore of Moore Hall, obtains a bespoke suit of spiked Sheffield armour and delivers a fatal kick to the dragon. Moore Hall is a 15th-century (or earlier) residence immediately below the gritstone edge of Wharnccliffe Crag (from Wikipedia)
